

Remarks made to introduce my amendments to C Morantz's motion:

- I want to thank C Morantz for taking my call when I reached out to offer a refinement to his motion – and want to thank him for allowing some hours of trust so we could work collaboratively to elaborating on his motion and to incorporate my amendments to seek more accountability.**
- We work under a governance model that is not designed to encourage collaboration – a governance model that has not been updated in 20 years.**
- but C Morantz and I worked through barriers and we have come to what I believe is a comprehensive motion to address accountability and answer questions. I'm encouraging all Council members to support this.**

- **I believe the mismanagement, lack of oversight, lack of adherence to process and restriction to information on this file - reflects directly on poor political and administrative leadership.**
- **Four senior transportation engineers - with over half a century of engineering experience - who worked on this file - have left the City – in a year where we are doing record road construction. The departure of these engineers –is a catastrophic loss that will reverberate throughout the system and will cost taxpayers dearly.**
- **An Audit is one tool we can use to seek accountability – but for the record, I and others will continue filing access to information requests, seeking external legal advice, and investigating through other avenues.**

- In closing, I want to note I am disappointed in having to call a second audit of administrative process under this Council. To me, this CLEARLY points to a larger problem that must be addressed- that being the governance model that lays out how we receive and share information to make decisions.
