STANDING COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION:

On February 22, 2021, the Standing Policy Committee on Innovation and Economic Development passed the following motion:

WHEREAS detailed and official population estimates by ward are only available every five years through the census and otherwise is an overall city population statistic;

WHEREAS City of Winnipeg population growth has been strong since the last census in 2016;

WHEREAS more frequent updates will be helpful for analysis and policy development;

WHEREAS economic research may be able to estimate, within a margin of error, the population during intercensal years using internal permit, taxation and other internal and external sources;

WHEREAS these estimates will be superseded by the 2021 census, and future census;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Public Service provide an updated population estimate by Ward in 90 days, and forwarded to the Executive Policy Committee.

## EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Canadian Census of Population is taken every five years with the most recent taken in May 2016 and the next one scheduled for May, 2021. Population and demographic information at city sub-levels such as ward or neighbourhood does not typically become available for over two years after the census is taken. (the last one was just over 3 years)

Although Statistics Canada produces population estimates for Winnipeg annually to reflect population growth, the estimates do not indicate where the growth has occurred. This makes it difficult for City Councillors, the Public Service and external organizations to identify where to focus efforts in order to accommodate residents in newly developed areas.

Providing population growth estimates by ward will help decision makers make more informed decisions by highlighting where changes to population is occurring and help better identify current needs.

## RECOMMENDATIONS

1. That the updated ward population estimates contained in this report be received as information.
2. That the Public Service be directed to report back with annual updates on the matter, starting in December 2022.
3. That the proper officers of the City be authorized to do all things necessary to implement the intent of the foregoing.

### **Inputs and Methodology**

The ward population estimate utilized 2016 Census population figures from Statistics Canada. Census data includes [institutional population](#), but it misses some of the population. This is referred to as the [undercounted population](#). To estimate population by ward, the undercounted population needed to be added back into the census population figures. The undercounted population was distributed by electoral ward by applying each ward's "Global Non-response Rate" (GNR) from Statistics Canada, to the undercounted population (Stats Can 2020 estimate less growth). Growth rates were developed using "Detailed Building Permit Data" extracted from the [Open Data Portal](#). Only permits that added or removed dwelling units with finished dates between May 10, 2016 (Census Day) to July 1, 2020 we included. An average persons per dwelling type for Winnipeg from the 2016 Census (Catalogue Number [98-400-X2016017](#)) was applied to each permit record along with a 3.1% Average city-wide vacancy rate from the [Canada Mortgage and Housing Corporation](#).

### **Assumptions**

It is assumed that population growth derived from permit records will not be "[undercount population](#)". It is also assumed that added and removed dwelling units affect population at (or close to) the average persons per dwelling type rate supplied by Statistics Canada for the City of Winnipeg and the vacancy rate is also consistent (or close to) at 3.1%

### **Risks**

Persons per dwelling unit for created and lost units may deviate from the city-wide average. Vacancy rates for new units may be less than the city-wide averages.

Two separate populations (growth and undercount) were estimated using Statistics Canada Rounded figures, city-wide averages and rounding in their calculations.

Inter-Census population estimates by ward have not been calculated before and as such have never been compared to actual Census figures to root cause discrepancies. Calculating up to July 1, 2021 for comparison to this year's Census may help root cause these type of discrepancies.
