Item No. 6 New 2022 Capital Projects – New Provincial Funding for Road Construction, Rehabilitation, Preservation and Repair Projects

STANDING COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION:

On July 5, 2022, the Standing Policy Committee on Infrastructure Renewal and Public Works concurred in the recommendation of the Winnipeg Public Service and submitted the following to Council:

1. That the City of Winnipeg accept funding from the Province of Manitoba in the amount of \$8,851,695.34 for the purposes of road construction, rehabilitation and preservation projects, including the repair and filling of pothole and road cavities to be expended to the extent possible by December 31, 2022 and in any event prior to December 31, 2023.
2. That Council retroactively approve and ratify the funding Agreement with the Province of Manitoba, signed by the Chief Administrative Officer on June 10, 2022 to implement the intent of the foregoing.
3. That Province of Manitoba funding in the amount of \$8,851,695.34 (plus interest) be included in the 2022 Capital Budget and allocated to the Regional and Local Street Renewal Program and that this funding not be subject to City overheads.
4. That new 2022 Capital Street Renewal project locations as identified in Appendix A be approved within the 2022 Regional and Local Street Renewal Program.
5. That up to \$800,000.00 of the Province of Manitoba funding of \$8,851,695.34 be allocated for granular surface roadway repairs encompassing application of 33 cubic metres of gravel per lane-kilometre on up to 138 kilometres of granular surface roadway, where deemed necessary by the Public Service, including maintenance hours required to maintain the roadways in 2022 and 2023.
6. That the Proper Officers of the City be authorized to do all things necessary to implement the intent of the foregoing.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Government of Manitoba has established a fund of \$15 million to provide municipalities with financial support for road construction, rehabilitation and preservation projects, including the repair and filling of pothole and road cavities. The funding is allocated to municipalities on a per capita basis. The allocation to the City of Winnipeg (the “Recipient”) is \$8,851,695.34.

The terms and conditions of the one-time grant stipulate that the Recipient should endeavor to complete the project by December 31, 2022. However, if the contribution is not fully expended in the 2022 construction season, the remainder of the funding must be expended by December 31, 2023. The Province has since clarified that only the types of projects noted above qualify for this funding.

In order to help alleviate some of the road conditions encountered this spring, the Public Service is proposing the following allocations to the Regional Street system and granular surface roads.

1. Approximately \$1,160,000.00 to undertake short term asphalt resurfacing treatment on various regional streets with the intent to complete as many of these projects in the 2022 construction season as possible.
2. Approximately \$1,110,000.00 to undertake mill & fill treatments on various regional streets with the intent to complete these projects in the 2022 construction season if possible.
3. Approximately \$5,780,000.00 to undertake rehabilitation treatment of various regional streets with the intent of undertaking engineering design in 2022 and construction in 2023.
4. Up to \$800,000.00 for granular surface roadway repairs encompassing application of 33 cubic metres of gravel per lane-kilometers on up to 138 kilometers of granular surface roadway, where deemed necessary by the Public Service, including maintenance hours required to maintain the roadway in 2022 and 2023. The 138 kilometers encompasses the full inventory of granular surface roads within the City of which some may be deemed to be in good condition.

Appendix A lists the regional street locations identified for the maintenance/renewal treatments describe in the allocation items 1 to 3 above. Appendix B identifies the granular surface road locations that may receive the maintenance treatments described in allocation item 4 above.

RECOMMENDATIONS

1. That the City of Winnipeg accept funding from the Province of Manitoba in the amount of \$8,851,695.34 for the purposes of road construction, rehabilitation and preservation projects, including the repair and filling of pothole and road cavities to be expended to the extent possible by December 31, 2022 and in any event prior to December 31, 2023.
2. That Council retroactively approve and ratify the funding Agreement with the Province of Manitoba, signed by the Chief Administrative Officer on June 10, 2022 to implement the intent of the foregoing.
3. That Province of Manitoba funding in the amount of \$8,851,695.34 (plus interest) be included in the 2022 Capital Budget and allocated to the Regional and Local Street Renewal Program and that this funding not be subject to City overheads.
4. That new 2022 Capital Street Renewal project locations as identified in Appendix A be approved within the 2022 Regional and Local Street Renewal Program.
5. That up to \$800,000.00 of the Province of Manitoba funding of \$8,851,695.34 be allocated for granular surface roadway repairs encompassing application of 33 cubic metres of gravel per lane-kilometre on up to 138 kilometres of granular surface roadway, where deemed necessary by the Public Service, including maintenance hours required to maintain the roadways in 2022 and 2023.
6. That the Proper Officers of the City be authorized to do all things necessary to implement the intent of the foregoing.

REASON FOR THE REPORT

Council approval is required to ratify the agreement signed by the Chief Administrative Officer on June 10, 2022 as well as to include the funding in the Capital Budget and to authorize new Capital Projects.

IMPLICATIONS OF THE RECOMMENDATIONS

Approval of this report will authorize and allocate the use of the new Government of Manitoba funding for various road renewal projects.

Note that in order to comply with the Province of Manitoba's funding timeline as indicated in their letter of June 3, 2022, the City signed the agreement on June 10, 2022.

HISTORY/DISCUSSION

Severe winter and spring weather conditions contributed to deteriorated road surface conditions throughout the Province.

Within the City of Winnipeg, Regional Streets, mainly ones in poor condition with higher traffic and truck volumes, were particularly affected, impacting the movement of people, goods and

services. While some of the most impacted routes correlate to locations already forecasted for renewal in the 2022 Capital Budget and five-year forecast, there are many other routes that were affected.

In response to above-normal deterioration of road surfaces throughout the Province, the Province of Manitoba is providing a one-time grant of \$15 million to municipalities, of which \$8,851,695.34 has been allocated to the City of Winnipeg. These funds are to be used exclusively for road construction, rehabilitation and preservation projects, including the repair and filling of potholes and road cavities. The terms and conditions on which these funds are provided are relatively standard but the Province has been clear that the funds are to be expended to the extent possible by December 31, 2022 and in any event no later than December 31, 2023.

To qualify for this funding by the Provincial deadline of June 10, 2022, the Chief Administrative Officer signed the required funding agreement with the Province pending Council's approval. This report is seeking retroactive approval by Council to accept this funding and ratification of the funding agreement with the Province.

Council acceptance of these funds will enable street work to be conducted at the locations set out in Appendix A.

Assuming Council concurs with the acceptance of this one-time grant, the Public Service has identified projects that align with the terms and conditions for project expenditures. Note that ineligible project costs include municipal employee salaries and benefits, dust control, purchase of tools and machinery, feasibility studies, financing charges, legal fees, overhead, and the Goods and Services Tax (GST). This eliminates the ability for use in operating expenditures for pothole repairs and instead, the Public service is recommending all of the available funds be allocated to the capital budget.

Asphalt resurfacing treatments are being recommended at a number of locations where a more permanent renewal is not forecasted to occur in the immediate future. These resurfacing treatments are expected to improve the surface condition of these locations in the short term until longer-term rehabilitations or reconstructions can be programmed. The resurfacings would be estimated to improve the surface condition for approximately 5 years to a maximum of 10 years and be about one-quarter the cost of major rehabilitation.

In addition, a portion of the funding is being recommended for some permanent mill & fill and rehabilitation projects that are not currently programmed in the regional street program. The locations chosen have straight-forward scopes of work and are of modest value such that they can be successfully completed within the time limits identified.

In order to expedite the asphalt resurfacing and mill & fill locations for 2022 construction, these project locations will be added to existing consulting engineering assignment and construction contracts as changes in work. The distribution of the work will be based in part on geographic locations of existing construction work as well as an ability for the contractor to complete the work in an expedited fashion.

On June 9, 2022, Standing Policy Committee on Infrastructure Renewal and Public Works considered a recommendation of the Riel Community Committee and recommended to Council that the Winnipeg Public Service be directed to allocate up to \$800,000.00 from the Province of Manitoba's one-time grant of \$8.9 million for road repair, to the application of 33 cubic meters

per lane kilometre on the City's 138 kilometres of granular surface roadways, including the maintenance hours required to maintain the roadway surface.

Currently the level of service for granular surface roads is to maintain them in passable condition. Many of these gravel roads have been particularly impacted by the spring weather conditions. The additional proposed funding for granular surface roadways will allow some proactive treatment to occur that will improve the level of service in the short term.

This report is recommending that this one-time Provincial funding is not subject to City overheads as overheads are an in-eligible cost under the terms and conditions. The terms and conditions also stipulate that the contribution of \$8,851,695.34 must be deposited in an interest bearing account until expended and any interest earned will form part of the contribution. As such, the amounts as set out in this report will be increased for interest earned on deposited funds between the time of deposit and the time of expenditure.
